| antennae | A pair of feelers for sensing the world around them |
| abdomen | Where you would find the stomach of the animal |
| thorax | The middle part of the body that has the head, legs and wings |
| segment | Divide (something) into separate parts or sections |
| exoskeleton | A hard outer layer that covers, supports, and pro- tects the body of an invertebrate animal |
| mammal | An animal that gives birth to live young |
| habitat | The place where and animal lives |
| Respiration | A process that involve the intake of oxygen and the release of carbon dioxide |
| Excretion | Eliminating or expelling east matter, e.g. faeces |
| nutrition | The process of obtaining the food necessary for growth |
