Criteria	A standard by which something is judged	
Investigate	To find out as much as possible	
Evaluate	To decide how good something is, after thinking carefully about it	
Needle	A thin pointed piece of metal with a hole for thread at one end	
Thread	A strand of cotton, silk etc used for sewing	
Stitch	To make loops of thread in sewing	
Running Stitch	A simple needlework stitch consisting of a line of small even stitches which run back and forth through the cloth without overlapping.	
Cross Stitch	A stitch formed of two stitches crossing each other	
Binca	A type of fabric used to guide sewing
