Artist	Someone very skilled at painting, drawing or making things
Image	A representation of the external form of a person or thing in art
Colour Palette	The range of colours used by a particular artist or within a particular piece of artwork
Medium	The materials that are used to create a work of art
Swirl	To move in a twisting or spiralling pattern
Spiral	Winding in a continuous and gradually widening or narrowing curve
Dash	A horizontal stroke
Line	A long, narrow mark or band
Plastisphere	The term used to describe the ecosystems which have evolved to live in human-made plastic environments.

Skills and techniques

- Select and develop ideas confidently, using suitable materials confidently

- Begin to explore possibilities, using and combining different styles and techniques
- Develop watercolour techniques .
- Explore using limited colour palettes
- Use the work of artists to replicate ideas or inspire own work

- Use wires to create malleable forms
